a. Planning application DC/21/04734 granted for re-siting existing shed in rear garden at Clay Cottage, Back Lane, Kettlebaston has been granted.

- b. Planning appeal DC/21/02442 refused for erection of detached cartlodge building at Prestige House, The Street, Kettlebaston has been refused.
- C. The councillors agreed to make no objection to the Application for works to Trees(S) in a Conservation Area - DC/21/06300 - Fell 1No twin stemmed Lime (T1); Reduce height of 1No Silver Birch (T2) by up to 1.5m, at The Old Convent, The Street, Kettlebaston, Suffolk IP7 7QA

### 13. Councillors reports

<u>Water is leaking onto the road outside Prestige House</u> and into a neighbouring garden. Clerk to liaise with Highways and planning. Also hazel hedge has not been planted as agreed in the planning permission – clerk to follow up.

<u>Concerns raised about the size of the unofficial waste</u> collection on local land – has it become a commercial site – ClIr to liaise

Stud – may close in February and become a beef farm

<u>Footpaths</u> - The footpath from High House Farm up to Castlehill has been ploughed and not re-instated. Signs at the Preston end of the restrictive byway have been removed and from the junction with the footpath to the Old Rectory

<u>Queens Jubilee</u> – Cllr Carpenter to liaise with village hall and church about an event Speed Watch – to be added to January agenda

<u>Evans Corner</u> – is Babergh aware of the grade II house's condition

<u>Village Hall Car Park</u> – A resident had proposed installing posts to prevent illegal entry with vehicles. The council members present thought that a hedge and gate would be more in keeping with the rural surroundings
